PCC Meeting Monday 7th January Summary

- Review of Christmas Events The Christmas morning service was very good. Carols on the Green probably worked out better with just a marquee and may be used again next year.

 Approximately 200 people attended. Almost all of the 100 books bought were handed out to people who had asked for them. About 300 youth tracts were given out to those who chose to take one.
- Business & Finance Income has gone up by about £6,000 including a £3-4,000 increase in planned giving, plus an increase in income from weddings and lettings. Church & Church House hiring rates have been increased by 3.5%. Fuel charges are higher this year.
- Fabric M Lucas mentioned that the Church House heating is very erratic and the building is sometimes like a sauna at night time, so he wondered if it is worth revisiting the issue of a smart thermostat as in the church building. P Jackson stated that the difficulty is that there are two different heating systems for Church House which people alter and then do not change back again after their use of the rooms.

- Evangelism The group would like to try something like a proper service at the village hall, suitable for non-church goers, perhaps on a Saturday afternoon with a view to getting the people eventually into the church.
- Festival 900+ D Wade mentioned that the earliest records of St Bots show that in 1120 a church building was started, and completed in 1122. There may have been a Saxon one beforehand, so there are at least 900 years of history. A summary of the group's meeting was circulated, containing a list of committee members and a list of proposed events to be spread over the year
