Being a Sight Loss Friendly Church

When you first become a SLFC, the number of things to do can seem a little overwhelming. We've come up with a handy set of prompts to help.



THINK

Whenever a church event is being planned, either in the church building or out in your community, think about what you can do to make sure that blind and partially sighted people feel included.



ASK

Rather than trying to second-guess people in the congregation, go and have a chat. Ask them what would help them and make them feel part of the church and its activities.



ACT

Make changes, adjust services and layout, use the free Torch Trust resources to make sure that everyone with sight loss feels totally included.

Spring's Top Tip

We're here to give you as much help and support as we can. Every newsletter will have a top tip for engaging with people with sight loss. Here's our tip for Spring:

When you need to leave the room let the person know you are going, otherwise they may continue to speak to you in your absence and feel embarrassed.



Meeting the team

Matthew Horspool joined Torch in April last year as a Torch and SLFC Representative, we caught up with him this week to see how he's getting on:

"My job at Torch is to give talks and deliver training to churches who are thinking about becoming sight loss friendly. We've got over 200 churches on our database with many more asking for information, so it's an exciting place to be. I have sight loss so it's easy for me to talk about it very personally."

"The biggest cause of sight loss is old age. We have an ageing population and pretty soon, we'll have loads of blind people in our communities who want to go to church but can't. The biggest issue that I can see is that people don't realise the extent of sight loss. If they don't see a guide dog or a white stick, they think they don't have any blind people in their church. This means they can be, quite unintentionally, neglecting people with conditions such as tunnel vision or those who are in denial about their sight loss but who need large print resources. Here at Torch, we're working with churches to dispel that myth. Once we get the message across and churches realise the scope, they come on board with the SLFC programme."
