1 In many parts of China, April ushers in the spring season. Please pray that the epidemic will recede as the weather is getting warmer.

2 Please pray for residents in Wuhan and nearby regions. They were locked down for nearly 2 months. Many people have been affected psychologically because of their lack of communication with the outside world, and their need for outdoor activities. Pray for God's mercy and healing.

3 Thousands of Wuhan residents died during the Covid-19 outbreak. Please pray for God's comfort for the bereaved families.

4 Today is Ching Ming Festival (also called Tomb Sweeping Day), a day when Chinese traditionally commemorate their ancestors, offer sacrifices to deceased family members. The Covid-19 outbreak has made this year's festival day more significant. Pray that the Lord will comfort all who are grieving and help them find the true meaning of life in Christ.

5 Today is the first Sunday in April. Many churches would normally have Holy Communion on this day. To prevent spreading of the virus, churches do not permit large gatherings. Please pray for these churches as they worship and conduct their Holy Communion services online.

6 Please pray for believers who are currently able to gather in twos and threes. Whether they are family members or close friends, meeting openly or secretly, pray for God's grace upon them all. When we pray for them, we also experience the "communion of saints".

➤ Many full-time ministers are since last year when their churches were forced to split into small groups. This year, Covid-19 has made their situation worse, because they do not have insurance or fixed income. Please pray for pastors and other church workers whose lives are seriously impacted.

8 A Christian businessman named Q was moved by the Holy Spirit to set up a special fund to provide aid to full-time church workers in the countryside and in 3rd tier cities. He is calling more believers to contribute to this fund. Thank God for these believers, and pray that more people will participate in this ministry.

9 Pray for a pastor named L. His village was locked down during the Covid-19 outbreak. All local ministries had to be suspended. In his church there are many elderly and sick members who need care. Pray for God's mercy and provision.

10 Today is Good Friday. Let us come prayerfully before the Lord, and meditate on the significance of the crucifixion.

11 Today is Holy Saturday. Let us reflect on that day when

the disciples were fearful, sad and deeply disappointed, following Jesus' crucifixion. Let us remember that God was powerfully at work, even in the darkest and saddest time. Let us pray that Chinese Christians will hold fast to their hope in Christ.
