Notes - from Revd Andy Clark's talk from last week, 30 August. Psalm 51

What is the greatest need? At present it is probably a need for a vaccine for COVID 19. There is no solution at present to the pandemic; we follow rules; many of us remain 'locked in'.

With all this going on do we do I forget eventhing also ar ignered.

With all this going on do we, do I, forget everything else or ignore other things because of this greatest need?

David has forgotten everything. Nathan the prophet tells David that God knows all that David has done, like committing adultery and murdering. He tells David that all this makes a barrier between David and God and that David ought to be an outcast. Fortunately David realises that God is gracious and loving, no matter what.

David admits his sin, especially as it has been bearing on his mind. David realises that his sin reflects on God however big or small that sin is; God doesn't bother about the size, it's sin. He reflects on what made him do it and realises that sin was in him and all people from the beginning; look at Genesis, Cain and Abel for example. David asks himself, as we should ask ourselves, 'Do I just sweep it away or keep it locked down?' David makes the move. He calls on God to restore the relationship, to make David as white as snow. It's the same for us, me. I cannot do anything. Only through the blood of Jesus shed on the Cross can God see me if I am as white as snow. David promises God that he will tell everyone that God has removed his sin. God needs our, my, broken heart, like David, before God can see me. I must tell everyone about it too.
