




Men@St Bot's



ADVENT BOOK


ADVENT BOOK - a great way to get ready for Christmas!


What's on at St Edmund's

Mission Focus Please Pray For:

Dragan our mission Partner in Sarajevo says:

In our humanitarian work with Roma people, things are starting in a good way. We have already provided some schooling necessities for some 35 Primary school kids, yesterday my wife and 2 more ladies from the church purchased winter jackets and caps for them. The funds for that were provided by TEN through their winter program. Hopefully, already this Saturday we will meet the kids and their parents and give them these gifts. Also, we will "adopt" 20 of the poorest families in their community and try to provide for them monthly help of food, hygienic materials, and similar things throughout next 12 months, thanks to St Botolph's generosity. Also, we expect other sources for other kind of aid to our church which we are planning to channel to this particular Roma association. Eventually, I hope that we will be able to establish mutual trust and offer other type of help like additional classes for kids which have problems with different subjects, maybe some meetings with women in sense of emotional support and so on. My hope that, when the summer comes, we will be able to take some of them to our church camp and serve them there. Just to clarify, it is not our church camp, but our small denomination has a nice piece of land and couple of buildings close to one of the most beautiful lakes in Bosnia, really God's gift to us.
