As usual, St Botolph's will be sponsoring food parcels, through Transform Europe Network (TEN), so that TEN's overseas partners can purchase locally the food they put in their humanitarian parcels. Destinations will include countries caring for refugees from Ukraine, and also our sister church in Sarajevo.

So, this is what to do:

Prayerfully decide how much you want to give towards Harvest for the Hungry. Then

Put your gift (cash, or cheque made out to "Transform Europe Network" - NOT made 1. out to St Botolph's Church- and write "Harvest for the Hungry" on the reverse) into an ordinary envelope clearly labelled Harvest for the Hungry.

- Either hand your envelope in with the collection on Harvest Festival Sunday or the З. following Sunday, or hand it in to the Church office or to Derek Wade or Tim Bland.
