What Does it Mean to Have Faith?

Over recent weeks I've been thinking a lot about what it means to have faith in God. Perhaps you have been a Christian for many years or maybe you are still unsure about what it means to live as a Christian day by day; maybe you find following Jesus is relatively easy at the moment or, as is perhaps more likely, you struggle with a daily routine which includes regular prayer and Bible reading?
