Summary of the Minutes of the Vestry Meeting and the Annual Parochial Church Meeting of St Botolph's Church held in Church on Monday 24th May, 2021

40 parishioners attended the meetings which were chaired by Revd Mark Lucas

At the Vestry meeting the minutes from the meeting on 8th April 2019 were approved.

There had been two nominations for the two positions for election of Churchwarden, and the following people were duly declared elected to serve as Churchwardens for the next year: Peter Jackson Adrian Keach

It was reported that at the end of 2020 there were 224 people on the Electoral Roll. A new roll was required to be drawn up and at the date of the meeting there were 229 people on the Electoral Roll.

Adrian Keach said the Churchwardens had felt that Revd Lucas, Revd Clark and Helen Tilney had gone more than the extra mile with their work during the pandemic, so they had asked the Bishop of Peterborough to grant Revd Lucas and Revd Clark a fortnight's extra holiday, and their request was granted. They advised Helen Tilney that she would also be granted an extra fortnight's leave. These periods will be taken during July and August. There will be one Sunday service at 9.45am at St Botolph's, and one 11am service at St Edwards and cover had been arranged for the services where needed.

At the Annual Parochial Church Meeting the minutes from the meeting on 8th April 2019 were approved.

There were 6 places for Representatives of St Botolph's due for election on to the Deanery Synod and 6 nominations had been received, so the following were duly declared elected to serve on the Deanery Synod for the next three years:

It was noted that the names of 2 members of the PCC had been omitted from the Annual Report (p11) i error, those of Sheila McElhone and Richard Sewell whose terms come to an end in 2022. There were 4 nominations for 10 vacancies for election onto the PCC and the following were duly declared elected to serve on the PCC for the next three years:

Martin Adamson Kate Curnock Helen Tilney David Wright

Revd Lucas commented that anyone who missed the deadline for applications may approach the Churchwardens as it may be possible to co-opt them onto the PCC.

Alan Deans was appointed as Independent Examiner for the next year.

Annual Reports\*: Treasurer D Wright gave a presentation regarding the finances of the Church and it is planned to put the detailed charts on the Church website.

Revd Andy Clark highlighted work with the youth, explaining that 1 eighty grew over Zoom, and even more came to meetings in the marquee. Claire Harris, Lindsay Burch and Georgia Candlin have joined the 1 eighty and Rosie Dooley the Link leadership teams. Revd Lucas commented that the youth ministry was the biggest in England outside London and the Bishop thought Revd Clark was the best youth minister.

Helen Tilney highlighted work with children and families and gave thanks for the support she had received. A dozen children attend weekly Zoom meetings and they are blessed in that children are coming but it is for families to instil the love of Jesus in their children. Nicola Farrier and Pippa Evans are involved. The challenge is for groups to start up again, and there may not be four groups until next year.

AOB Revd Lucas wished to thank Revd Robert Bashford for his continued Daily Thoughts. P Jackson mentioned the online survey was being used in planning for the future. C Bilski asked for considerations o be given to the work with the older people. No date was set for the next APCM.
