What Does it Mean to Have Faith?

Over recent weeks I've been thinking a lot about what it means to have faith in God. Perhaps you have been a Christian for many years or maybe you are still unsure about what it means to live as a Christian day by day; maybe you find following Jesus is relatively easy at the moment or, as is perhaps more likely, you struggle with a daily routine which includes regular prayer and Bible reading? Restrictions due to the pandemic may have prompted you to stray from your relationship with God or (hopefully) they have led you to rely more on him for your daily needs.

In our Promise Land sessions for the children and at our Refresh group for mums and babies, we've been considering the lives of Abraham, Moses and others and what made them paragons of faith.

Hebrews 11:1-2 says

'Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see.

This is what the ancients were commended for.'

Do you believe what you read in the Bible? Do you think back over your own life and see God's hand at work?

God made promises to Abraham concerning his future and the blessings that would be his. The blessings that God promised seemed impossible in human terms, but 'Abraham believed the LORD, and he credited it to him as righteousness.' Genesis 15:9

God fulfilled his ultimate promise to his people in the person of Jesus. Do you believe that Jesus died for you? Do you believe he is alive in heaven today, praying for you? Do you believe that he loves you? I pray that you do. That is faith!
